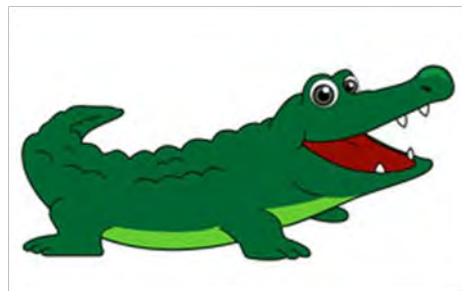

LADIES

On Thursday, **November 15th** from 10 a.m to 2 p.m. the Mammobile will be coming to Blue Heron Pines to administer mammograms to women who will be eligible for the procedure.

If you haven't had your yearly mammogram within a year and a day of November 15th, your health insurance company or Medicare will pay for the test. There will be more information concerning the mammobile in the coming newsletters.

October 5th there will be a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board. There will be enough time to accommodate 15 ladies



within the time period that is allotted to our community. Your mammogram will be sent to Cape Coral Radiologist and a copy sent to your doctor and you after the reading of the xrays.

Please consider having this done. We must have at least 10 to 15 ladies sign up for the procedure for the mammobile to come into our park. It is a wonderful convenience to all those ladies who can't drive to their clinic or haven't had a mammogram done in recent times.

November Ballot Issue

Ballot Number 2 effects the assessment placed on our homes. As the present time, the rate cannot be above 10%. If this Constitutional Amendment is not passed, the sky's the limit on how much could be charged for property tax assessments. This Amendment will make the 10% cap PERMANENT.

This is important to ALL Florida Manufactured Home Residents. So all Florida State Voters need to vote YES to protect the tax cap!

Your leased lot is assessed and taxed as commercial property. Assessments on commercial property have been restricted to 10% annually.

Property taxes are passed on pro-rata if that is permitted in your prospectus.

Amendment 2 must pass by 60% in November or the restriction ENDS!!!

Want Quick Shade? Try VINES!

Recently BHP neighbors asked me vines for a pergola to have a shady respite to sit outdoors. We all have lovely screened porches/lanais, but from an enclosed porch or lanai, we often miss the butterflies in the garden, much the cool natural breezes, or just the joy of being outside, surrounded by nature, and not cooped up. There are many lovely patios by homes in BHP, but you seldom see anyone on them....the sun is too hot!

Vines grow much faster and are far less costly than a shade tree. Within just a couple years, you can have that shady respite outdoors. There are close to 100 vines that can be grown in south Florida, my list has 84 so I can't list them all here. Some are evergreen, some are flowering, some are aromatic, some are annuals, which die after a year, but usually reseed themselves to begin the next year; almost all vines are easy to grow. This is great, because they contribute so much to the looks of our homes.

Vines soften the harsh corners of architecture, such as walls and fences. They transform unattractive posts, trees, and poles. They can be used as a privacy screen to block unsightly



views. They can attract butterflies, birds, and honey bees. Like all plants, they put oxygen into the air, and take in our carbon dioxide. And in this very hot climate, they give cooler SHADE.

Typical of Florida plants, vines occasionally need trimmed. But remember, Mother Nature doesn't grow rectangles, or round balls; let them look natural. Some can be quite aggressive in growth, however, these are just the varieties that you may wish to use to shade your car, an arbor, or pergola. There are also much less aggressive vines for covering posts, etc.

Some vines cling or attach to surfaces using specialized tendrils or adhesive rootlets that can be difficult to remove. Other "clinging" vines have tendrils that simply curl around supports like lattice, mesh, etc.

"Twining" vines climb by encircling vertical supports, such as poles, or lattice. "Sprawling or Clambering" vines are basically shrubs producing log shoots with no means of attaching themselves to a support. These need to be manually wound around the support or braced up.

Do some investigating on which is best for you. And remember the healthiest plants are always those in their own native environment.

Many people, especially new residents, may not know that we have our own large ball ten pin bowling league, which runs from November to March. It is open to both men and woman residents but is not a couples league. Single bowlers are very welcome. Also, husbands and wives are not placed on the same team. Everyone gets to play.

We bowl every Wednesday afternoon at Bowland Lanes on Harbor Boulevard in Port Charlotte. Practice starts at 2:50 p.m. followed by games at 3:00 p.m. Three games are played. Roasted Apricot Chicken and Cauliflower

3 Boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cubed
1 bag frozen cauliflower florets
1 tablespoon vegetable oil
¼ cup apricot jam
Cooked rice, for serving



Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Spray a baking sheet with cooking spray
2. Combine the chicken, cauliflower, vegetable oil, and Jam in a freezer bag. Shake until well coated.
3. Lay on prepared baking sheet in a single layer and roast 30-35 minutes, until chicken is cooked through and cauliflower is tender.
4. Serve with the rice.
