The Have a Heart Program is now approaching its 2-year anniversary, and today 212 homes in Blue Heron Pines display a red heart. The goal from the beginning was to have 300 homes with a red heart, and we are approaching that number.

The simple act of displaying a heart makes it easy for dog owners to identify and respect property owners who are willing to allow a dog to use

the edge of their property if needed, and at the same time a promise to clean up after your dog. Have a Heart also allows dog owners to identify property owners that would prefer a dog did not enter their property.



Displaying a red

heart helps to reduce the friction between dog owners and those that do not own a dog. It is not a perfect system but has helped to ease the tensions that once existed.

Along with Have a Heart, we petitioned for a new dog park. The facility was more than we expected and is heavily used all year long. Thank you Sun Communities.

pg12572@gmail.com or give me a call at 941-505-4066 and leave a message. We will place a heart on your post within a week of the call.


Once you display a red heart, we ask that you adhere to the following simple suggestions:

- Pick-up after your dog
- Respect the property of others, keep your dog out of gardens in front of homes
- Accidents happen and sometimes a dog will do his thing on a non-heart property... just clean up so nobody is offended, try to direct your pup to a nearby heart property
- Nobody enjoys it but if you see a mess left by a <u>less considerate resident</u>, pick it up if possible
- The same cleanup rules apply to the dog park
- If family or grandchildren are visiting and have a dog or walk yours, they are expected to pick-up after the dog...that is not always happening
- No dogs on the golf course or cart paths.
- Dogs must be leashed and in control at all times

That's all it takes to be a good dog owning resident here at Blue Heron Pines, and we must protect the privilege of being able to own and enjoy our furry friends.

FMO District Meeting Serendipity MHP North Fort Myers

The Serendipity MHP has 338 lots, is 97% occupied and is in the SUN Communities family of manufactured homes.

Kristie Kulwicki, the featured speaker, is a member of the North Fort Myers Fire Department CERT team (Community Emergency

Response Team). She reminded us all of the importance of *replacing* smoke alarms every 10 years. Most have a 10 year warranty and will become unreliable after 10 years.

When you purchase a new Smoke/Fire Alarm you need to purchase one with a 10 YEAR Battery NOT a 10 YEAR Warranty

They are not the same. There are also Fire Alarms that can be purchased for \$7 that are not 10 year warranted but they will have a backup battery.

Kristie also spoke on the Pet Finder program that includes a sticker for your home in the event of fire. It notifies responders that there are pets in the home that will need to be found.

Kristie discussed the Medical Red Dot program for residents to use so responders can find their medical information in the event of a medical emergency. The sticker goes on your front door and a packet is attached to your refrigerator with medical information enclosed.

Also speaking were Tucker DeMuth and Bryce Mednick of Professional Insurance of

Florida, an FMO Preferred Provider. They are a company that is a big supporter of the FMO.

This company covers all types of insurance needed for manufactured home residents: Homeowners Insurance, Brokerage Account Review, Medicare Supplements, CD, IRA, Annuity review, Life Insurance, Long

Term Care, Cancer Insurance, Auto Insurance and Final Arrangements. They have coverage available for all types of home insurance from policies that cover everything to those that cover only fire, no hurricane or flood.

Next meeting is at Lakewood Village, 5601 Duncan Road, Punta Gorda. The meeting is at 1pm on Friday, March 8, 2019. The featured speaker will be David Berman of Professional Insurance of Florida, an FMO Preferred Provider.



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
