EGADS!! "THEY" are BACK!!

No, I DON'T mean snowbirds; I mean those black LOVEBUGS---UUUGH! This is the time they hit us in droves, as we take a walk, covering our car as we drive, till we must stop and wash down the windows and grill before we even reach our destination. We forget I-75 for a while. We try to stay on blacktop and wear sunglasses even at dusk.

WHAT are these things? An untrue rumor is that University of FL created them when manipulating DNA to control mosquito populations. They are a non-pest fly all along the Gulf Coastal regions that doesn't seem to be a priority for funding, even though various fungi are suspected of being natural controllers. They don't bite, transmit diseases, and with the newer advances in automotive paint, they don't badly pit or etch the paint as they used to. But they can clog vehicle radiator air passages causing a reduction on the cooling effect on car engines. HOA MEETINGS The **HOA Board** meets on the 3rd Thursday of each month and the **HOA Membership Meetings** are on the 1st **Tuesday** of each month during the month of October through April beginning at 7:00 PM. The February Membership meeting is the Annual meeting at which Board Member elections are held. The meeting agenda is posted on the bulletin board 48 hours prior to the meeting. All HOA members are encouraged to attend the Board meetings. If you have an issue or concern, please contact a Board member prior to the meeting to have that item added to the agenda or sign in before the meeting. You will have 3 minutes to speak about that item during the meeting. (This is the "Sunshine Law" as defined under Florida Statute 723.078.) In addition, at the end of each meeting there will be an opportunity to ask questions or present items for discussion

HOME OWNERS ASSOCIATION

(HOA) Membership in the Home Owners Association is not mandatory, however, the Board represents the home owners of Blue Heron Pines as a group and provides a united voice for the home owners. They work as a liaison between BHP Owners/ Management and the residents. The cost is \$20 per year (Jan 1-Dec 31). This entitles the home owner to one vote per household for election of Board Members and any issues that need to be voted on. This money also pays for holiday events, kitchen supplies for Saturday Coffee and various activities, Legal fund, decorations for the Clubhouse, copying costs, reduced price on tickets for HOA events and more. Renters are also encouraged to join the HOA. Although they cannot vote, they are welcome to participate in all of the Blue Heron Pines activities and events as a member. WILDLIFE: Warm spring weather means it's time to brush up on tips for living with alligators and other wild critters. It is very important that you DO NOT feed any of the wildlife in and around our park. From the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission website: "In Florida, it is ILLEGAL to feed manatees, sandhill cranes, bears, raccoons, foxes, and alligators." We need to do our part by making sure we are not providing any food for any animals (including birds and ducks). If you have a fruit tree, make sure you pick up fallen fruit. Above all, if you see an alligator, just leave it alone! The same is true of the coyotes people have seen out and about at night. If you leave them alone, they will do the same.

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
