
Sympathy to Pat on the passing of Rick. He will be missed

Rules for BHP Beanbag Baseball 2021

Principle of the Game

The game is played on a board stand with bean bags. Rules are similar to real baseball - person throwing continues until he/she gets 3 strikes. An inning is over when each team has 3 outs. A game is complete after 7 innings.

Team Play

6 - 9 players are required for each team to play. Each team nominates a captain and chooses a name.

Playing the Game

A coin toss will determine which team goes first. The winner has the choice to start first or pass to the other team.

Each player throws the beanbags until he has a base hit, makes 3 strikes, or makes an out.

Home plate will clearly indicate where thrower will stand. A chalk line will be drawn. The Player may touch the line with the foot, but if the heel goes ahead of line the thrower is out.

Each bag thrown that misses a hole is considered a strike. If the 1st or 2nd throw enters a FOUL BALL hole, it is considered a strike.

A player is out when they have 3 strikes, or if they throw a bag into the hole marked OUT. If the 3rd bag enters the FOUL BALL hole, player is allowed to throw another beanbag.

The inning ends when each team scores 3 outs.

If a beanbag only half enters a hole, it does not count, unless a following beanbag thrown pushes it in. In this case, only the first bag counts.

Player must touch each base. Players must throw in proper batting order.

You must throw beanbags underhanded.

No Smoking within 50' of playing area.

Keeping Score

- Each team will keep score using the score books provided.
- Fill in team name at the top of the page.
- If a player throws a beanbag in the hole indicating 1st base, a line is drawn from home to 1st; the same for 2nd and 3rd and home run.
- When a home run is thrown, fill in the base and highlight the HomeRun box. These solid boxes are how you keep track of the runs.

COVID-19 Restrictions:

- Masks are mandated.
- No Hugging and High-Fiving. Cheering encouraged.
- Social Distancing required.
- Team members are restricted to team area.
- If you have any symptoms of anything respiratory, please stay home.

I GET QUESTIONS....

One of my design clients recently asked me, WHAT can I plant under my oak tree? It's so full, the shade won't let anything live there. I asked her without seeing it yet, was she sure the shade was the problem? There are many native plants that grow in shade down here remember, Florida originally was almost all overgrown, thick, swampland! It was my guess that the tree roots were the real problem.

Here at BHP most of us with Oak Trees—or other shade trees—have "lollipop" cuts, and the roots are trimmed so they don't rip up all concrete work in the vicinity.

But even by trimming the roots of a shade tree, the roots near the trunk are often near the surface, preventing a healthy undergrowth. I suggested the client think of ground covering plants, as their root system needn't be deep, and the plants will spread over the surface ground. Another idea is to "plant" pots in the ground, digging out a space for them, and putting plants in the pots. Then you can water and nourish the pots without the tree roots taking it all.

If you decide to use some of the various types of ferns down here that spread, these plants in sunken pots will *easily* take over your bare spot. There are tall, mid-sized, and low ferns in differing varieties and speeds of spread. Other examples to plant would be Algerian Ivy that only gets about 1' high. ("Snow- cap is variegated), and Cast Iron Plant, about 12-18" high. Submitted by Sharon Breay



WILDLIFE: It is very important that you DO NOT feed any of the wildlife in and around our park. From the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission website: "In Florida, it is ILLEGAL to feed manatees, sandhill cranes, bears, raccoons, foxes, and alligators." We need to do our part by making sure we are not providing any food for any animals (including birds and ducks). If you have a fruit tree, make sure you pick up fallen fruit. Above all, if you see an alligator, just leave it alone! The same is true of the coyotes people have seen out and about at night. If you leave them alone, they will do the same.
