### PROTECT YOUR LIFESTYLE and STAND-UP for HOMEOWNERS STRONGLY OPPOSE SB 818 sponsored by Senator Ed Hooper, (R-Clearwater)

This anti-homeowner bill is very alarming to homeowners and will negatively impact our standard of living. Many of us are retired or unable to move and we need affordable housing. When we chose a mobile/manufactured home community as our lifestyle, the park or community owner made promises about living in his park.

This anti-homeowner bill basically gives the park owner permission to ignore many of the promises and guarantees he made and that we are paying for. There are so many upsetting parts to this bill and these are just a few of them.


- Removes the right to assume a lease and receive the initial prospectus that goes with the lot in accordance with the DBPR decision in 2011 and upheld on appeal.
- Permits adding an unlimited number of units to a park with no requirement to increase or add
  amenities for the new units. This would dramatically affect our pool, clubhouse, exercise area, or game
  area.
- Permits changing the current prospectus without disclosure to homeowners.
- Permits them to be able to have new residents sign for an integrated prospectus which was not approved by the DBPR and not one presently approved for your park.
- Requires a new buyer to make changes prior to occupying the home which should be purchased as is. Resales may become impossible.
- Removes the requirement for certified mail if there is an eviction notice.
- Permits one notice of all rent increases regardless of the anniversary date which will be too confusing.
- Prohibits an experienced negotiator or attorney from attending the negotiating committee meeting.

This bill will cause so much upheaval and unhappiness. We have more faith in the Legislature than to let this happen to our Seniors, Veterans, and all those of us living on fixed incomes.

#### THE WINTER GARDEN....

Winter is here—in all its glory for Floridians. I've enjoyed seeing the various "northern" annuals flowering. Up north, they bloom for one season, and then go to seed to be replanted next year, hence their name "annuals." Down in SW FL they often just keep blooming, especially if planted in the shade so our hot southern sun doesn't bake them. Many still die of heat by summer, and others are quickly devoured by our microscopic soil nematodes that love non-native plants, or other insects feeling the same. But this is a great time to enjoy them while it's a bit cooler. While they were \$1.33 in November, and tiny plants, I put several into pots in shady areas, and have so enjoyed them this winter as they grew and are flowering profusely. It is not too late to enjoy some. I love true tropicals with their exotic huge leaves and flowers, but variety IS the spice of life.

And after being almost totally wiped out by downy mildew disease this last few years, a new resistant variety of classic Impatiens, called Imara Impatiens are back, loving winter sun to full shade, and blooming their heads off.

Also, it is not too late to plant cool weather vegetables although early January is my favorite time to plant seeds. Grow your own salad greens in pots or raised gardens. Carrots, peas, and beets are also cool weather vegetables. Seeds are inexpensive and you will have many more than your household needs if you plant most of the packet. A house around the corner from me has some really big green tomatoes that were probably much earlier. I hope to put in some tiny pear tomato plants (taste sooo sweet!) by late February or March that will bear profusely until mid-July. Most tomatoes will not set blossoms for fruit when it gets hot.

Our featured speaker was Atty Jennifer Howell. She is a Board Certified Elder Law Attorney with an office in Punta Gorda. She spoke of Estate Planning and the need for: Last Will & Testament, Power of Attorney and Health Proxy. If Estate has to be probated in the State of Florida, Probate processtakes 3% of the value of the estate. That is why it is so important to have a Will. How things are owned trumps a Will. If property is in 2 names the survivor is the beneficiary. If parent and one child are on the property and there are more than one child. Upon death, survivor listed is the beneficiary. Other children, even if named in the will, are not beneficiaries because of a living named survivor. That is why it is important to be aware when listing children on property and bank accounts. Something else to be aware of is if the named child is sued or has monetary issues. Your property can be taken for those debts because their name is on the property. Be aware! Review your Will in a new State of Residency. There may be differences from one state to the next that could effect your property.

Power of Attorney is only effective while living. It is in effect as soon as it is signed. If there is no power of attorney, property could be forced into Guardianship.

Health Proxy is to protect Medical decision making

HIPPA is permission to receive medical information

Living Will can be written or oral for Health Care surrogate. Best to be written, can always change it orally. Revocable Living Trust is a set of instructions to control your assets. Documentation should be updated about every 5 years. If you have specific items to be left to specific people, just make a list. It does not have to be notarized or witnessed. Atty Howell addressed numerous questions from the floor, many regarding Canadian residents and Out of State residency and relatives.

Christie Kulwicki of the North Fort Myers Fire Department also spoke at the meeting. She discussed and demonstrated Hands Only CPR and the use of an AED. The AED talks you through the entire procedure. If someone is in distress, call 911 then check the Carotid for a pulse, then pump on the chest, do not worry about breaths. Place victim on the ground, compression only NO MOUTH TO MOUTH!! Don't stop compression until AED is placed on the victim.

FMO President Jerry Durham talked briefly reminding us of the negative effect that SB818 and SB 998 would have on our communities and our lifestyle. He urged us to contact our legislators to let them know the effect the passage of these bills would have on thousands of Manufactured Home Community Residents across the state.
